2. Review of minutes from last meeting: Donna

3. Treasurer's Report: Tracy

4. Principal Report: Tracy & Andrew

- Update to entry system to gates
 - Gates are locked until 9:10 am (students must maintain physical distance prior to school as students must remain in cohorts until entry to school – except 2 X 7/8 classes)
 - o Pool of people coming around 9:00am
 - Starting today (Dec 1), gates will open at 9:00am (larger gate) and cones will be placed along the fence closest to parking lot 6 feet apart
 - Students are to stay with family groups and line up at the cones until 9:10 and then they can head to classroom lines once the bell rings
 - This is in response to safety needs of students
 - Will be implemented for both gates (Thurber St. and McKenzie Ave.)



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- Feedback after one day parents appreciated that their children were safe and social distanced
- Will continue and monitor
- Dismissal Time Safety Concerns
 - At dismissal time, Thurber St. is a challenge as students need to watch before walking across street; cars are pulling up and parking both directions
 - Could invite police to ensure safe for students and parents are parking appropriately (on the right side of the street)
 - Encourage parents to go through student drop off instead of parking.
 - Even though there is a wait, recommend to go into the line and be safe for students
- Sports for 7/8 Students
 - Administration to communicate with other elementary schools in our Family to determine if we will have a FOS volleyball tournament
- Support for Families
 - Salvation Army Christmas Support available for families
 - Applications due to Salvation Army for December 3.
 - Gift cards (no food) and gifts this year.
- Superintendent Visit
 - Superintendent Jennifer Perry visited on November 18
 - Shared Baseline Assessments in Literacy and Math, provided tour of school, shared overview of student wellness and mental health initiatives
- Staffing
 - Hired Mrs. Alana Powell as LTO for English side of French Immersion Class Grade 2/3/4 (Afternoons)
 - Mrs. Sarah Crowe, hired as Contract EA
 - Lindsay Wheeler hired as LTO ECE Room 105
 - Additional allocation for Vice Principal (Mr. Pratt is now 0.6 Vice-Principal which is an additional 0.3)
 - 0.3 posted Kylie Sheets successful candidate will begin on January 3rd, 2022. In the meantime, LTO posted and is currently being supported by Mary Birnie
 - Our school has been allotted an additional 0.5 Educational Assistant. This contract position has been posted on Apply to Education.
 - Mrs. Knapp Irvine, grade ¾ teacher is currently off. Mrs. Kelly Morrow is currently filling day to day
 - Mrs. Lea Somers is currently in the LTO for Mrs. Uniacke in the Power Up Program 2

 - They will need to be assembled and installed on school yard in the spring when the ground is thawed.
- Positive Behaviour Program

 - o Prices have increased; therefore, council has decided to decline

8. New Business: Donna

- Milanos Pizza Day

 - Numbers: 366 students and 45 staff
 - Confirmation of numbers coming from Tracy for order
 - Donna requires schedule lunch break for multiple delivery

 - Students Cheese pizza only
 - School Council Members who meet visitor attestation criteria can help out on the Pizza Day – Health Guidelines for handling food must be followed – posted in servery
- Christine McCaw asked on behalf of staff
 - o What are the teachers able to approach School Council for?
 - In the past council has supported guest presenters e.g., Scientists in Classroom, Materials to support class rewards for Positive Behaviour Program, fillable water stations, math materials e.g., Tiny Dots games; Year End Trips and Celebrations, Grad Awards, etc.
 - Not to fund items funded through provincial grants
 - Staff ideas
 - Would like more technology

- Process for bringing in more tech
 - CUP Critical Upgrade Process

 - We are currently at max capacity from the school board requirements – there is tech that needs to be replaced based on age and ability to support current Apps (e.g., iPads)
